Three classes have yet to start: Maritime Radio, Navigating with GPS and Radar for Pleasure Craft, so if any of these strike your fancy come along and register.


Canadian Power and Sail Squadrons (CPS) has been undergoing a lot of changes recently, and more changes are in the works. Regular membership is declining – more people are leaving CPS than joining it, which if not remedied will inevitably lead to the demise of the organization. White Rock Squadron is not isolated from this issue, although our regular membership has remained fairly flat. One proposal being considered is to give CPS Associate members full membership in CPS (CPS Associate members are those that have passed the BoatPro course, Regular members have passed the Boating course). In some parts of the country, where all boating is done on uncharted non-tidal lakes, Squadrons are having difficulty putting together their Bridges, while at the same time CPS Associate members are interested and willing to stand for office (currently not permitted under CPS bylaws). This debate will continue over the next year. Our Squadron has taken the position that we need to look at enhancing the value of membership while continuing to maintain high standards. You will hear more on this topic during the year.

At the end of October the CPS National AGM takes place in Nanaimo. At least four of our Bridge members will be attending. CPS is a bottom up organization made up of volunteers [Editor's note: see page 10 for more information about being a volunteer]; the CPS National AGM is an important meeting that provides direction to the National organization.



#### Government & Industry Liaison Report 13 September 2010

The advisory committees traditionally cancel meetings over the summer months, hence, there is very little to report. There are, however, several items of news that may be of interest:

1. **Sue Pickrell**, local Coast Guard hovercraft captain, is about to become Marine Superintendent of SAR in the Victoria Rescue Centre. Sue has an outstanding reputation as a hovercraft captain and is an exemplary role model for young women contemplating a Coast Guard career.

#### 2. Immersion suits aboard Canadian registered vessels

Transport Canada is considering adopting the International Life Saving Appliance (LSA) standard for immersion suits. This standard permits the use of suits with inherent buoyancy and also those without inherent buoyancy which require the use of a lifejacket to be worn over the immersion suit. The current Canadian standard permits only those suits with inherent buoyancy. This matter will be discussed by the Standing Committee on Construction and Equipment during the Life Saving Equipment Regulations update. Public input must be submitted by Sept. 20, 2010.

#### Recreational Vessel Courtesy Check Program (RVCC) Western Region 13 September 2010

The RVCC program is off to a good start in Western Canada. Activity is currently taking place only in the Lower Mainland – Fraser Valley area, however, we are confident that the program will be expanded to the northern areas of BC and to our neighboring Districts (WCID, VISD and VIND) for the 2011 program year.

No statistics are available at this point in time as inspection forms are still being submitted and it is expected that inspections will continue in to the autumn season which for many is still prime boating season.

From the inspections done to date, it is fairly evident that the compliance rate for boaters associated with yacht clubs and major marinas is quite high. The challenge lies with the owners/operator of small trailerable craft, many of whom lack familiarity with the requirements outlined in the Safe Boating Guide.

CPS members interested in participating in the RVCC are invited to attend a special RVCC seminar to be held on Friday afternoon, October 22, 2010 at the CPS National Conference in Nanaimo. A seminar agenda is not yet available but will be circulated as soon as it is finalized.


