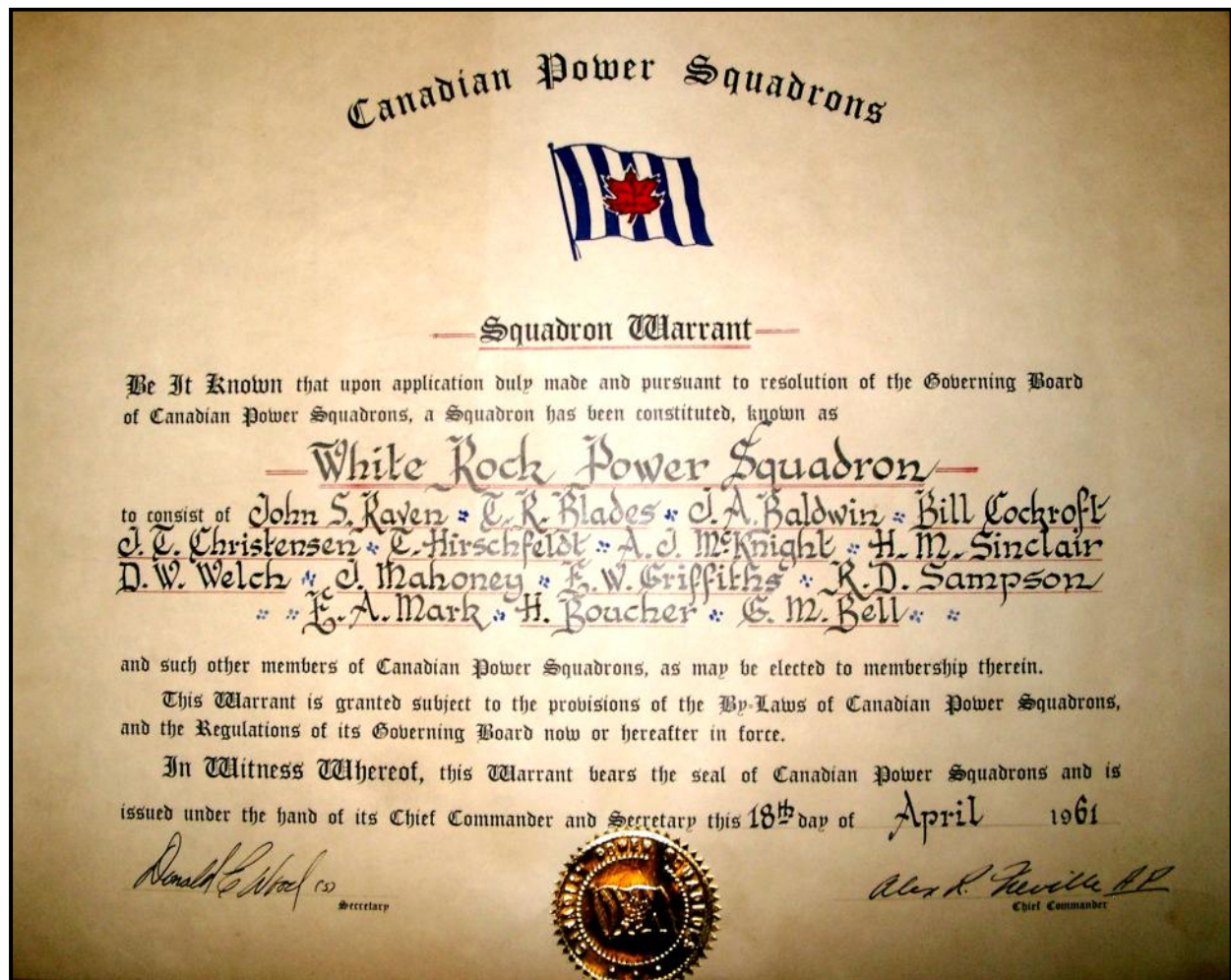

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

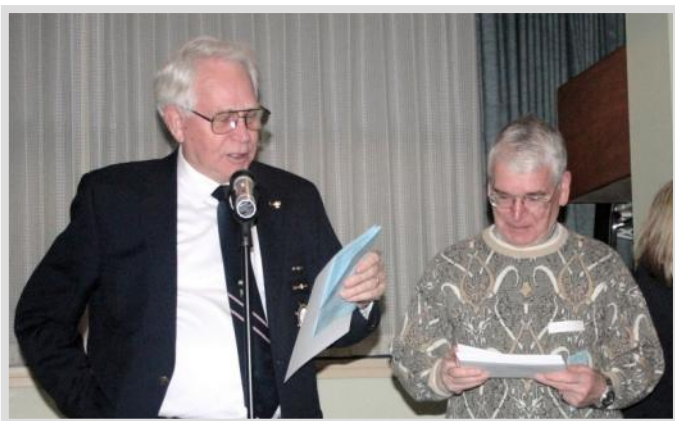

Government & Industry Liaison Officer's Report

P/D/C Jerry Powers, SN

Items that are of interest to recreational boaters are as follows:

Caraholly Range (Port Moody)

Pilings/towers for the new range were constructed in February 2011. Lights will be set in place this month; alignment and final surveys will be done by the end of March 2011.

Canadian Harbour Charts

CHS is proposing to add a 15 metre contour to harbour charts, the first of which will be those covering the Second Narrows area. CHS is currently trying to determine the most effective means of highlighting the new contour. The 15 metre contour is becoming more critical to the deep-draft vessels plying our harbour waters.

BCIT Simulator

The BCIT Marine Campus in North Vancouver received a new simulator package earlier this year. It consists of a 360 degree tug boat simulator, 7 new blind pilotage bridges complete with 3 plasma screens each and a new engine room simulator equipped with diesel electric, medium speed and low speed diesel simulation. Installation and testing is currently in progress and should be fully operational by the end of March 2011. The new facilities will enable agencies such as BC Ferries to train all their staff locally rather than having them attend institutes in the United States.

Washington Marine Group

The Washington Marine Group will henceforth be known as the Seaspan Marine Corporation.

Operations will consist of Shipyard, Marine Tug & Barge and Coastal Intermodal Ferries

This event, jointly sponsored by the Office of Boating Safety of Transport Canada, Marine Trades Association and Mustang Survival, is designed to promote awareness of the importance of wearing lifejackets. Once again, we are encouraging CPS members to come out with their inflatable life vests and to participate in the group inflation.

Mustang will be providing free replacement CO2 cylinders for all participants. Since this event will mark the start of National Safe Boating Week, we would like to see PMD's promotional booth on site and we intend to have several of our RVCC safety equipment checkers available to do inspections.

IMPORTANT SAFETY NOTICE:
Dehumidifier can pose serious fire hazard

Dear Valued Customer:

Guangdong Kelon Air-Conditioner Co., Ltd., in cooperation with the Electrical Safety Authority (ESA) and Health Canada, has announced a voluntary recall of approximately 220,000 Whirlpool branded 25 pint and 35 pint dehumidifiers. Consumers should stop using these products immediately.

An electrical failure in the dehumidifier's circuitry can overheat, posing a fire hazard. Kelon has received reports of seven (7) incidents from consumers in Canada, where about 220,000 units were sold, that resulted in fire, smoke and property damage.

We are in the process of contacting consumers regarding this recall. Our records indicate that you may own an affected dehumidifier.

The affected dehumidifier was manufactured in white only. The brand name, Whirlpool, is printed on the top of the dehumidifier. The model number is located behind the water bucket and serial numbers are printed on a label located on the side of the unit as pictured below. Affected model numbers include:

History of White Rock Power Squadron – the First Year (1961)

The persons who provided this information are C.W. (William) Cockroft and Eric W. Griffiths, both of whom are listed as founding members in the Squadron's Charter dated 18 April, 1961. Mr. Cockroft was the squadron commander in 1962/63.

In 1961, Eric Griffiths and his father, Walter (Wally) Griffiths, owned a General Motors dealership named Midway Motors located at 1549 Johnston Road in White Rock. This site is presently the approximate location of a Kentucky Fried Chicken franchise and is just north of a well-known White Rock landmark known as the "Whaling Wall", a two-story sized, outdoor mural of killer whales in their sea habitat. At approximately the same time as the founding of the squadron, the Griffiths constructed a large, second floor loft above Midway Motors, which accommodated practically all of the squadron's

"on land" activities; it was a convenient locale for meetings of the Squadron Bridge and for socials. The potluck dinners and dances held here were very well attended and lively. Guest speakers were brought in for social education nights and "boating" classes began here in the first year.

The first instructor to provide boating instruction was a sailboat owner from Vancouver named Bill Morrow. He used "the hall" above Midway Motors as his classroom and also attended the squadron 'socials'. After some time, however, it became difficult for him to come to White Rock on a regular basis to instruct. A hiatus in regular boating instruction developed until Bill Gage, mentioned in my previous letters, re-initiated regular courses two or three years later.

The Griffiths were obviously strong promoters of the squadron.

As well as providing "the hall" as a venue for squadron activities, they owned a major part of the squadron's floating assets. At the time, they owned a 100-foot wooden vessel, the "Columbia", retired as a mission boat, which had been plying the British Columbia coastline for some years. The Columbia was built in New Westminster in 1914 and was re-named the "Lady Valentine" by the Griffiths. They also owned a 65-foot vessel, the Vantonia", which is now a charter boat in the Skeena River. Both vessels were moored across from White Rock in Blaine Harbor, Washington, behind where the Harbor Cafe is now located. We do not know the present location and fate of the Columbia cum Lady Valentine.

Note: Squadron Bridge meetings were first held at Midway Motors on Johnston Road.

CPS/ECP is embarking on the second year of a three year RVCC program in partnership with Transport Canada. While we currently have a number of certified RVCC checkers in the Lower Mainland, we would like to have more to be able to cover all boating venues in the area. Accordingly, I will try to schedule another training session with Transport Canada within the next few months. Squadron Commanders are urged to inform their members about the program and to provide me with the names of those interested in participating in the program.

The RVCC program will be extended to Vancouver Island this year and two training sessions have been scheduled for May 7th and 8th, 2011 in Nanaimo. Efforts are also being made to get the program established in the southern Vancouver Island/Gulf Islands region, northern BC and in the Columbia/Okanagan/Shuswap area of southern BC.

West Vancouver Yacht Club will be hosting a safety awareness day on Saturday, April 23, 2011. They have requested the presence of safety inspectors from the CCG Auxiliary and CPS RVCC

to conduct inspections of boats moored at the WVYC.

The second annual "Ready – Set – Inflate" event designed to promote the wearing of PFD's or lifejackets will be held on Saturday morning, May 21st, 2011 at Vanier Park in Vancouver. Since there is a very busy boat ramp in the vicinity, we want to have a number of RVCC safety inspectors in attendance throughout the day to conduct safety inspections and make the boating public aware of the RVCC program. ■

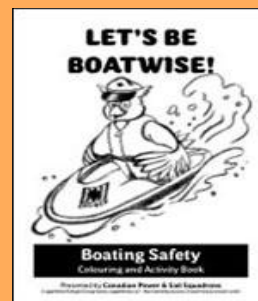

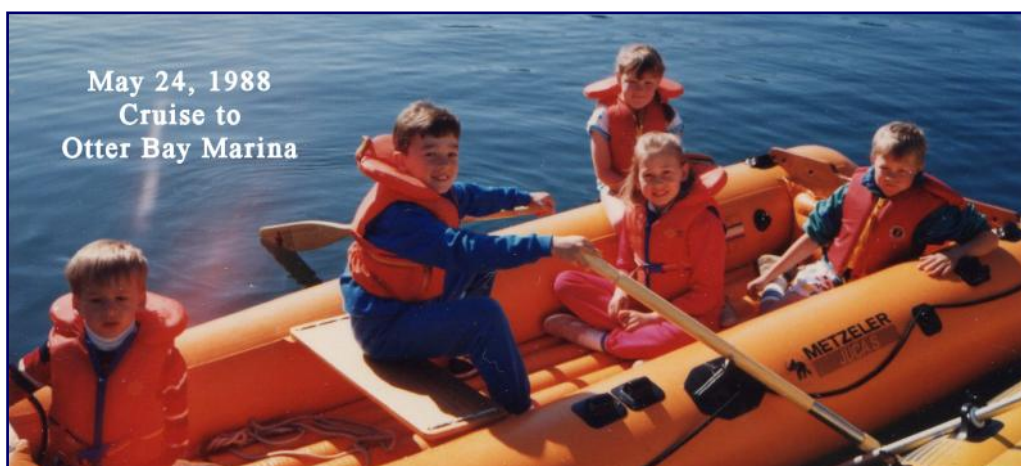
